COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

A couple of weeks ago, parish rectors and council delegates gathered for our annual Diocesan Council of the Episcopal Diocese of West Texas. Of course, the gathering was a bit abnormal due to the pandemic context necessitating that we gather virtually over Zoom. Nevertheless, Council was inspiring, uplifting, and a great joy for all involved. Your delegates and I attended virtually to hear the diocesan annual budget, reports, elect folks to various committees, and to hear Bishop Reed's address. This was my first Council in the Diocese of West Texas, and though under abnormal circumstances, I was thoroughly impressed and inspired by the compassion, professionalism, care, and joyful nature of the gathering. It is my great pleasure and honor to serve as the rector of St. Stephen's. I continue to be impressed and thankful for the tremendous community of the church. You are truly a beacon of light sharing God's love and compassion to our surrounding community, and for this I give thanks. God bless you!

The results from SSEC's *Statement of Financial Activities* and *Statement of Financial Position* for January 2021 have revealed a very strong flow of Pledge revenues, due in large part to Pre-Paid/Carried Forward Pledge receipts designated for 2021, but paid in late December 2020; along with some lump sum annual Pledge payments made in January, but representing the Member's entire year Pledge commitment. Normal monthly accruing Pledge receipts totaled \$29,127 for the month of January, accompanied by \$78,050 Pre-Paid/Carried Forward receipts, plus \$12,300 of Annual Lump Sum Pledge receipts, resulting in a cumulative Pledge Revenue total of \$119,477. Other Revenue categories, totaling \$7,017, brought cumulative revenue totals to \$126,554 for the month of January, exceeding Budget by \$8,969.

The expense side of the Statement of Financial Activities revealed cumulative expenditures of \$45,255, bettering Budget expectations by \$3,683. Bear in mind as several expense items are paid on a quarterly or semiannual basis, we should expect expense outflows will likely elevate during the final months of a quarter and at mid-year. Even so, Parish Administration has done yeoman's work in managing the expense side of operations.

The summarized Revenue/Expense schedule in this article, juxtaposes December 2020 to January 2021 activities, revealing a rather sharp contrast between year-end 2020 and the first month of 2021. To add perspective to the contrast, it is important to understand the unique scheduling of Revenue inflows pertinent to Pledge receipts that include not only Pre-Paid/Carried Forward receipts, but also lump sum annual Pledge receipts, and a scattering of prior year Pledge receipts. These one-off circumstances, touch down in such large numbers such as would seemingly lead one to conclude that a robust first month of the year will beckon similar numbers in the months that follow. That is not to be expected, although some lump sum annual Pledge receipts will recur in the next month or two of 2021's first quarter. Once we have left the first quarter of 2021, the curve of monthly cumulative Pledge receipts will flatten a bit, as will monthly and year-to-date Net Ordinary Surplus/Deficit figures.

In summary, one-off Pledge receipts have infused the operating account with cash at an early point in the year, but revenue flow in succeeding months should temper any expectations that a robust flow of Pledge receipts will be the norm. A good beginning to the year, nevertheless.

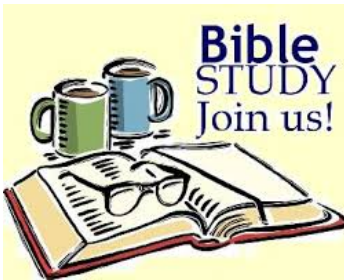

NEW ADULT BIBLE CLASS TO START AFTER EASTER



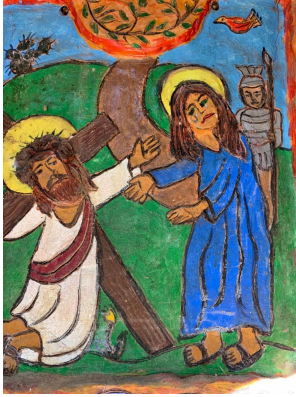

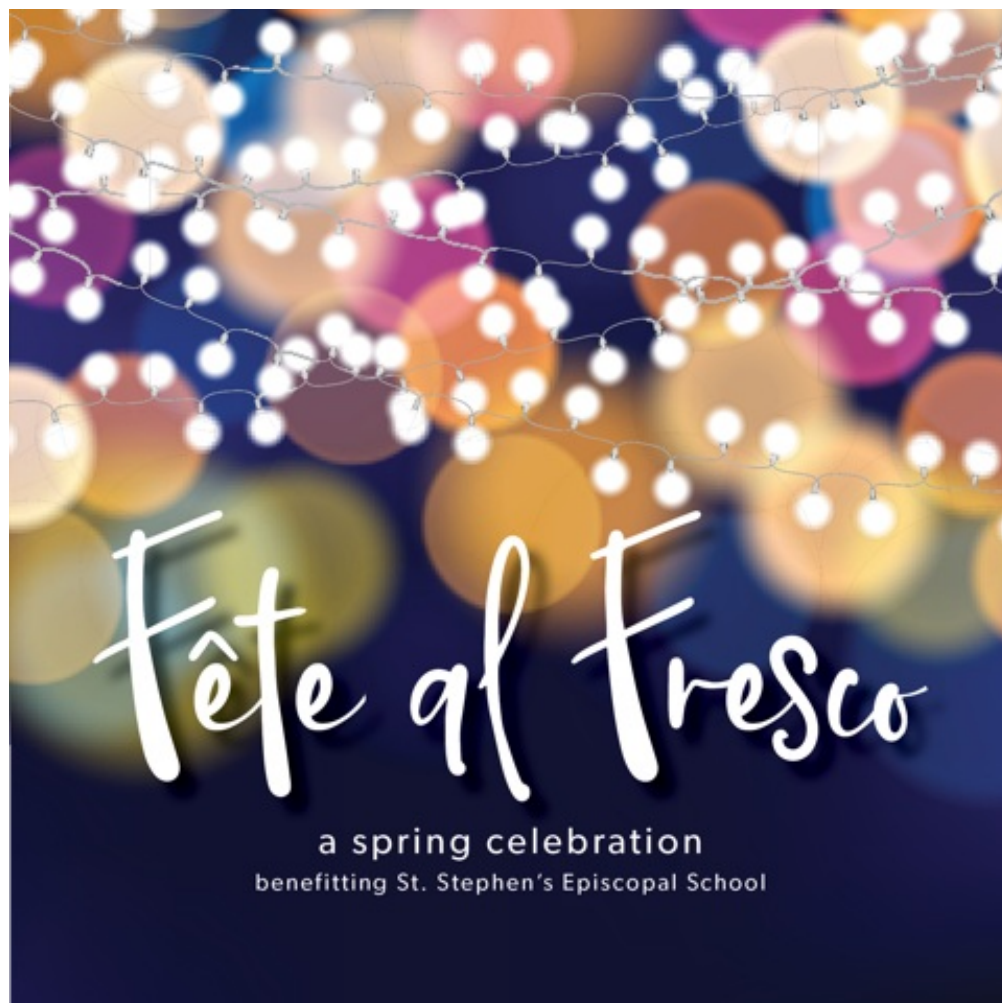


ATTN: FAMILIES WITH CHILDREN AGES 4-12 SPEND A WEEK IN GOD'S GARDEN
