### LETTER FROM THE RECTOR: PANDEMIC PROCEDURES By The Rev. Kevin LJ Schubert



Dear St. Stephen's,

Greetings and prayers from St. Stephen's Episcopal Church in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Over the past 18 months our community has been deeply affected by the global pandemic caused by COVID-19. We have experienced a number of hardships and difficulties to be sure. But, at the same time, we have also experienced a tremendous amount of hope, faith, love, and compassion. I have been taken aback by this community's resilience and determination

through it all. Our community is strong and healthy; and continues to be a vibrant

reflection of God's love for our members and the community that surrounds us.

From the very beginning of my call to be your rector, we have maintained the importance to keep the safety and health of the community; striving to make responsible decisions to accomplish this. Over the past week or so we have been confronted by a new season within the pandemic. Though I had hoped that we would continue to move forward with decreasing our regulations regarding the pandemic, it is now apparent that we must take important and responsible actions to safeguard the health and safety of our community. The current introduction of the Delta variant of COVID-19 is extremely contagious and even affects those that have been previously vaccinated. This is a great concern of mine, and I have decided to take action to safeguard our community from its effects.

After careful discernment with our church staff, Senior Warden, and with support of the diocesan office through the Bishop; beginning this Sunday, August 8, 2021, I have decided to re-instate the use of masks for all persons (vaccinated and unvaccinated) for all church activities on campus.

Beginning Sunday, August 8, 2021, all persons—vaccinated and unvaccinated are required to wear masks for all church activities on campus.

The current situation in which we find ourselves has determined this decision. You may also want to read the *Rt. Rev. David M. Reed's Pastoral Letter to the Churches* in our diocese, regarding the Delta Variant. At the bishop's request, I read his letter in church on Sunday, August 1, 2021.

The CDC advises that masks are the best defense against contracting the disease. We will continue all other activities for the time being: worshipping in building, gathering for meals, singing in service, etc. Hopefully we will be able to move forward without more change from our regular activities, but be prepared for more regulations if things become worse.

The decision to require masks for in-building activities is made to ensure that our community remains safe and healthy. This decision has been made with all members of our community in mind; especially for those that are not able to receive the vaccine yet, such as children under 12, and those with compromised immune systems. May we continue to have those in mind who are struggling right now with the effects of the pandemic, and may we continue to be diligent in our efforts to maintain the safety and health of our community. If you would like to discuss this decision further, please do *contact me*. I am available for you and your family.

School families will have an opportunity to meet their teachers and church families will have an opportunity to tour the school during its open house on Sunday, August 15. 

### **HEALING PRAYER RETURNS ON SEPTEMBER 22, 2021**



This fall brings the much anticipated return of the St. Stephen's Healing Eucharist. This service will be held weekly on Wednesdays at 10:30 a.m. and will last 45 minutes. On the third Wednesday of the month, we encourage you to stay after the service and to head over to McArthur Hall for "Great Generations."

The Healing Service will be held in the Chapel and begins in silence as we take our seat in the pews in prayerful consideration of God's saving Grace and Love. You can expect this service to contain a shared homily and a laying on of hands and anointing. Fr. Kevin will invite persons seeking anointing to come forward to the altar rail, at which time they are to provide their name and any particular request for prayer. Fr. Kevin will lay hands upon the person with prayer and anoint the person with oil. Communion and a Blessing will follow.

The Episcopal Church's understanding is that through the laying on of hands and the administering of the sacrament of unction (anointing of oil) God's healing grace is bestowed upon the sick and needy. This is so, with the full knowledge that God's healing and grace is available for all conditions of humanity.
