RECTOR'S CORNER

Principles 1 & 2:

The Elephant in the Boardroom

Editor's Note:

During the next few issues, Rev. Sandy will be sharing six principles that Jesus offered. Stay tuned next time for: complete the past and envision abundance.

<u>The Elephant in the Boardroom</u> (speaking the unspoken about pastoral transitions) by Carolyn Weese and Russell Crabtree offers Christian congregations a comprehensive reference book written to help parish

leaders execute a smooth pastoral transition. I want to share with you, as I did with the Vestry, some helpful concepts contained in their research.

You have often heard me say, "Jesus is our Model," and "the scriptures are our reference." St. Stephen's pastoral transition around "the rector's retirement" stands to gain important insights from pondering Jesus' model. Jesus had a transition plan too! It is well recorded in our gospels. His "transition plan" for his own disciples contained a vision for long-term results:



"You did not choose me but chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit...fruit that would last." - John 15:16

Jesus managed two major leadership transitions in His life. He managed his succession of his predecessor (John the Baptizer), and He managed his own departure with his disciples at the end of his life. St. Stephen's leaders must also manage transitions. In this context, management transitions are fundamentally expressions of genuine discipleship. To that end, Jesus' example was rich and illuminating. He offered six principles:

- 1. Honor thy Predecessor
- 2. Build on Health
- 3. Complete the Past
- 4. Envision Abundance
- 5. Create Capacity
- 6. Fight the Demons

I will present two principles at a time over the next three *eNEWS* editions. I will be quoting from Weese and Crabtree's book with occasional commentary. I believe these principles may help give us all a solid frame of reference as we move through the next three months of transition to my retirement together.

PRINCIPLE 1: HONOR THY PREDECESSOR

Use TLC (tender loving care) with members regarding a predecessor. That's talk; listen and confirm. Leaders help the transition process if they simply talk about their predecessor. Jesus did. He talked about John the Baptist on multiple occasions in public settings. Here is a list of some things he said about John.

"For John came to show you the way of righteousness. For John came neither eating bread nor drinking wine, and you say, he has a demon." - <u>Luke 7:33</u>

"The baptism of John...was it from heaven or from men?" - <u>Luke 20:4</u>

So...speak in positive terms. It is OK to speak in public. He/she was an instrument of God's plan for building the church. Listen to members and allow them to speak affectionately about the predecessor. It enables folks to integrate past into present.

"The surest way to botch a leadership transition and lock people up is to send the message that they cannot talk about the previous leader." -excerpted from The Elephant in the Board Room

This is often an obstacle posed by the ego...and ego means "Edging God Out!". So...confirm the importance of the past. Recall common threads and avoid itemizing series of unrelated "events." What are the important contributions? What differences in the life of the parish were made? So...Together: talk, listen, confirm...honor the predecessor!

PRINCIPLE 2: BUILD ON HEALTH

"Therefore every teacher of the law who has been instructed about the kingdom of heaven is like the owner of the house who brings out of his storeroom new treasures as well as old." - <u>Matthew 13:52</u>

Jesus reached into the treasure chest of the past and pulled out what was healthy and strong, thus fashioning the timbers of the new work He was building. Many stories were not original, neither were many of His ideas. Jesus knew where to find islands of health in his tradition and that is where He planted his feet. Jesus knew that the history of His people that held pockets of disease and dysfunction. He did not harp on them (polygamy, concubines, divorce). Rather, he went to the scriptures and spoke about health in marriage...that the two should become one. He zeroed in on the greatest commandment...most visionary grounded in truth...Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, strength, and mind." - Deuteronomy 6:5

Do not focus on wounds and weaknesses...rather, on health and sources of strength and renewal. A pastoral departure should not be treated like a terminal diagnosis. Yes, theres is appropriate grieving of loss, but framing it as illness may be counterproductive. Rather, treat it as moving from something to something. We need not focus on old wounds, but on sources of health, strength, and renewal. With the help of the Holy Spirit, it is always possible to frame one's work as completing the good work of another. That's what Jesus did. (The question Jesus put to the man at the pool,

"Do you want to be made well?". - John 5:6

Considerable pressure is often brought to bear on a new leader to fix what is brokenget inactive members to come back, restore the women's association to its former strength, visit the unhappy members, and listen to stories about problems with the former leader. Yes, tend the wounds, but do not focus on grief. Focusing on these pockets of dysfunction is a poor transitional strategy. Jesus knew that. Build on health. "**

- Learn
- Pray
- Worship
- Bless
- Go
- Rest
- Turn

As a LENT curriculum, *The Way of Love*, Hillary Raining and Jennifer Gambler have taken those disciplines and presented them in a seven-week program. The material is available on our church website, www.ststeve.org/lenten. It is presented as if you were participating in a small group. However, due to the STORY groups this year, we are unable to form more small groups. Perhaps, you would enjoy sharing the curriculum with a friend or two and creating your own small group.

My hope/suggestion is that those who have time and are inclined to add a Lenten practice may engage the weekly study in the curriculum. It is based on a particular scriptural passage each week. It would be good to keep a journal of your thoughts, feelings, insights, and observations. Each week you will find background information along with suggested prayers, reflection questions, and a plan for action.

BONUS LENT REFLECTION

Rev. Sandy offers the below piece to you, originally published in "Wishful Thinking" by Frederick Buechner, to offer you some challenging questions to ponder during Lent, which begins Wednesday, March 6.

Lent

IN MANY CULTURES there is an ancient custom of giving a tenth of each year's income to some holy use. For Christians, to observe the 40 days of Lent is to do the same thing with roughly a tenth of each year's days. After being baptized by John in the river Jordan, Jesus went off alone into the wilderness where he spent 40 days asking himself the question what it meant to be Jesus. During Lent, Christians are supposed to ask one way or another what it means to be themselves.

If you had to bet everything you have on whether there is a God or whether there isn't, which side would get your money and why?

When you look at your face in the mirror, what do you see in it that you most like and what do you see in it that you most deplore?

If you had only one last message to leave to the handful of people who are most important to you, what would it be in 25 words or less?

Of all the things you have done in your life, which is the one you would most like to undo? Which is the one that makes you happiest to remember?

Is there any person in the world, or any cause, that, if circumstances called for it, you would be willing to die for?

If this were the last day of your life, what would you do with it?

To hear yourself try to answer questions like these is to begin to hear something not only of who you are but of both what you are becoming and what you are failing to become. It can be a pretty depressing business all in all, but if sack-cloth and ashes are at the start of it, something like Easter may be at the end.


