LETTER FROM YOUR RECTOR FR. PHIL MASON



Dear Friends,

This Sunday, January 26, will be the annual meeting of the parish. (If you haven't heard, there will be one service at 9:00 a.m. followed by a breakfast taco Youth fundraiser in McArthur Hall at

the start of our meeting.) I am so very happy to be with everyone to review the past year and to take a look at the bright future of our beloved St. Stephen's Church and School.

About June 20th of last year, I took a call from the Bishop's Office--actually, I am sure that the call was from our true Master--asking me to be your Interim Rector. I took a deep breath; said, "Yes, Lord."

It will be five months since July 21st when I began this interim journey with our Church. I continue each day to think on how honored I am to be the one who helps St. Stephen's collect itself after Sandy's retirement and to prepare for the arrival of the next chapter to be lived in St. Stephen's journey along it's path with the Lord.

In our journey so far, I have seen some remarkable activity and achievements. A few of these I had a direct hand in, but mostly I have been here to give my blessing and support to so many wonderful servants of the Lord who also said, "Yes!"

One of the most memorable for me occurred when we found ourselves in need of a pianist. Allen Hennig, a long-time friend of Music Director Anne Jones, answered the call and agreed to be the interim pianist long enough to get us through Christmas. That was a relief, but it wasn't long before Allen, one Sunday morning, discovered the dusty unused organ in the Chapel. It was a bit crippled and more than a little out of tune, but the talented Allen could manage it and played it during services for a couple

of weeks. Encouraged by many and with Allen's generous help some repairs were made, the instrument was tuned, and it now sounds great! As a result, Allen having already fallen in love with us *and* the old organ, and we with him, decided that he would be our organist-pianist into the foreseeable future.

Next, we ushered in Advent and with much new enthusiasm for the beloved Chapel, Anne and Allen along with the choir and the refurbished organ recreated the beautiful traditional *Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols*.

It was lovely and the Chapel was full. Christmas Eve was also one of the most wonderful in my memory anywhere. Stay tuned...for we are making plans for a holy Lent and a glorious Easter.

The Halftime service, given the support it needed and the green light to continue, experienced a huge boost when one day Pat Hector brought Thea, her beautiful golden lab service dog, to sing to the accompaniment of my Native American flute. Thea continues to sing for us most Wednesdays, and I am looking forward to hearing her at the next 10:30 a.m. Family Celebration Sunday.

We moved the Healing Service to 10:00 a.m. Wednesday mornings and revamped the liturgy. It continues to be a very important offering for those who seek the healing comfort of our Lord for themselves and others.

We will be offering Taize worship in the Chapel at 6:00 p.m. the first Wednesday of every month, beginning February 5. Taize is a quiet meditative service with very easy to sing chants and periods of sacred silence and lots of candles.

Other happenings in the last year include: a new Widows Grief Support group and a year-round cancer support group to provide assistance to anyone with those needs. The Episcopal Church Women (ECW) group is active again. A picture directory has been prepared and should be in our hands shortly.

New staff members have been added in the last year. In addition to Allen, our wonderful St. Stephen's Episcopal School received a big boost when the new Head of School, Amanda Ebner, came on board. Amanda's indomitable energy and experience has brought new life to SSES. Elisa Webster has joined the Church staff as the Youth & Family Minister and Lydia Baese has come to be the much-needed administrative assistant to Jeannetta, our Parish Administrator. Lydia will be in the office to greet you and at the phone to answer your calls. Both Elisa and Lydia have long experience serving the church and will certainly bring the help we need.

It has been a very good year for our precious church family, and it is my prayer and expectation that 2020 will be even more exciting as a new Rector arrives and a new vision unfolds. I will be a little sad, though, for when that time materializes, my chapter with you as your interim will come to a close. More on that next edition.
