
LETTER FROM THE RECTOR:

Lessons from Dog Beings

My Dear Friends,

I brought our two Golden Retrievers to my church office for the first time today. Goldens have always been a part of our family. Most of the time we have had two, so Rosie and Peaches are our fourth and fifth canine children. Rosie is seven years old and Peaches is two -- 49 and 14 in dog year



calculations. Rosie is the calm, wise one and Peaches, the adolescent rascal who sees herself as a 65 lb. lap dog. Susan and I love these two as we would any other member of our family. They teach us some very basic lessons of life -- how to live life in the present moment and what unconditional love looks like. They teach us to wag more and bark less. Over and over in our lives we rejoice at the arrival of a new puppy and grieve when they all too soon die and then we start the cycle all over again.

Do dogs got to heaven? I can't say for sure, but as Mark Twain put it, "If dogs don't go to heaven, I want to go where they go."

As I sit and ponder these two, beautiful creatures of God, my thoughts expand to a much wider scope to consider the myriad of species on our planet -- our Pale Blue Dot -- all a part of the same creation.

"All creatures of our God and King" sings the words of the hymn written by St. Frances of Assisi. I seem to be continually making the point that we are all the same, made from the same stardust. And even more importantly, that we are all a part of the same thing—the creation. Our Judeo-Christian tradition seems to say that there is a creation and then there is us, somehow separate from it and in charge of it. There is no doubt that you and I are human beings and Rosie and Peaches are dog beings, and we have a great advantage over them and most other beings. The truth is there is no *us* and *them*, there are no others; there is only us.

God "blessed us with memory, reason, and skill" the eucharistic prayer proclaims. We have the intellectual capacity to hold one another in the highest personal regard, or indifference, or utter contempt. We can address the creation and it's lesser creatures in the same manner. If we hold it to be true that we are all a part of the same thing and there are no others, are we not loving or despising ourselves? Is the lovingkindness that

we show forth for the birds of the air in some way increasing the lovingkindness that we feel for ourselves along with all other beings? I can tell you that when Peaches maneuvers into my lap or Rosie gives me a kiss on the nose, my heart sings.


ALL-WOMEN BIBLE CLASSES



DWTX Spiritual Retreat in Recovery #114



We all know someone - spouse, family member, co-worker, friend, etc. - who is in "recovery". (Or at least someone we imagine ought to be - maybe even that face in the mirror.) Many folks think "recovery" is about what we run away from. It soon becomes clear that it is so much more about what we run toward.

The earliest founders and medical practitioners of recovery programs understood that the root cause of abuse is a "spiritual malady". As old as the Garden of Eden, it is the hubris that our human, ego-driven self-will can supplant the will of God. As we accepted our "dis-ease" and

recognized that there would be no cure provided by any *human* power, we prepared ourselves to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him, praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to care that out. What could be more fitting for a recovery retreat than that it be grounded in the historically spiritual roots of the Oxford Movement and the Episcopal Church.

The seminal Twelve Step recovery program Alcoholics Anonymous was co-founded in 1935 by Bill W. and Dr. Bob. The Rev. Dr. Sam Shoemaker, rector of Calvary Episcopal Church in New York, was an early and essential spiritual guide in the early years. In 1941, the Rev. Everett Jones, as rector of St. Mark's Episcopal Church in San Antonio, learned of the organization and understood its mission. He corresponded with the AA Central Office in New York, and later in 1955 with the help of members from Dallas and Houston, recovery became an active ministry in San Antonio. (Associated Twelve Step groups would subsequently form: Al-Anon, Adult Children of Alcoholics, NA, CA, et al. Recovery would later become a ministry of the national Episcopal Church.)

Following his consecration as Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of West Texas, the Rt. Rev. Everett Jones advanced the idea of holding recovery services in the church, leading to semi-annual Spiritual Retreats in Recovery beginning in 1961. This October 4-6, 2019, we will gather at our Mustang Island Conference Center for Retreat #114. As spiritual leader, Rev. Philip May, Associate Rector of Church of the Good Shepherd in Corpus Christi, will explore "family systems" and how people form groups - systems which can help us understand the sources of addiction and give us new tools to change patterns of the past and find healing. Break out sessions offer a variety of topics and activities. Members of AA, NA, CA, ACA and Al Anon share their experience, strength, and hope in a community of love and support.

The mission of the Spiritual Retreat in Recovery is to provide a safe place to deepen one's spiritual journey. It is open to anyone in recovery from alcoholism or other substances, and to families and friends affected by the disease of addiction. Here we seek its spiritual solution. Although grounded in Episcopal liturgy, this is not a specifically denominational event, and no church affiliation is required. Attendees will be treated to warm hospitality, delicious food, and thoughtful presentations in this beautiful setting along the Texas Gulf Coast.

Check-in is 5:00pm Friday and dismissal is 10:45am Sunday. The cost is \$195 per person (includes double-occupancy room and 5 delicious meals). A \$75 day rate is available for commuters. Reservation and Registration information can be found at https://www.dwtx.org/departments/committees/recovery-ministries/. Cut-off date for reservations is Tuesday, October 1, 2019.
