RECTOR'S LETTER: The Birthday of the Church

Dear St. Stephen's,

This coming Sunday, Pentecost, is always a monumental occasion for the church; and this particular year proves to be even more of a celebratory affair! The observance of Pentecost conjures up wonderful images of Jesus Christ providing his disciples with an advocate and

mediator between God and God's creation. After Jesus had ascended to the Father in heaven, the Holy Spirit becomes the intermediary between God and those of us living upon the earth. The Holy Spirit is a reminder of Christ's presence in our midst every day, every minute, every second. Being in the presence of our trinitarian God, we are assured of: companionship along the journey, confidence in our convictions, and the unbounded love that transforms the world. Traditionally, Pentecost is also commonly referred to as the birthday of the Church; as Peter and the other disciples open the doors of salvation and grace to the nations of the world; no matter what race, language, culture, or geographical distance.



I love this understanding as Pentecost being the birthday of the Church because in many ways we are being reborn into a new chapter of a life's journey here at St. Stephen's Episcopal Church! It is very fitting that this Sunday will begin a new understanding of life together as community. We will be gathering again for the first time in what seems like forever for in-building, in-person worship services at 8:00 a.m. in the Chapel and 10:30 a.m. in the Sanctuary (the 10:30 is also live-streamed). Each Pentecost service will begin in the Courtyard to ritually and thoughtfully enter the doors of our worship spaces.

On Sunday, May 23, 2021

meet first in the Courtyard.

We will then process to the Chapel for the 8:00 a.m. service and the Courtyard for the 10:30 a.m. service.

I imagine many of you are wondering how our ecclesial guidelines for in-building, in-person worship services have changed following the CDC's announcement to eliminate the requirement of wearing masks for fully vaccinated individuals. Though we have come a long way in maintaining the safety of our particular communities, it is important to acknowledge that we are not out of the woods just yet.

For our worship gatherings on Sunday mornings, we continue to ask that you wear a mask. I strongly encourage all in the congregation to become fully vaccinated. However, I understand that some in our community have decided to refrain from doing so. The current vaccines are also not available to the youngest members of our community at this time. For these reasons, it remains important for us to continue wearing our masks during in-building large gatherings. Another important caveat to all of this is that, as the Episcopal Church, we are under the authority and jurisdiction of our Diocesan Bishop. I am very pleased with Bishop Reed's latest communication that indicates the wearing of masks remains to be the expectation of churches in the diocese. Along with wearing masks, it's important to follow the guidelines that enable us to return to in-building, in-person worship services. *(See separate article in this edition for a review of these guidelines.)*

I am extremely excited to finally be able to worship at our regularly scheduled services in the Chapel at 8:00 a.m. and in the Sanctuary at 10:30 a.m. beginning this Sunday, May 23. I also recognize the excitement and energy that all of you are having for this great occasion. I want to express a tremendous amount of thanks to all who have been involved to prepare for these gatherings. It has taken a great deal of planning and creativity from various folks. I pray that you recognize God's blessing to be upon you this day and always. And, I will see you all on Sunday! You are invited to wear red clothing to signify this monumental celebration!

Editor's Note: the following is a summary of the St. Stephen's COVID Guidelines for Reopening. The Guidelines may be read in their entirety at: ststeve.org/covid.



Temperature checks are no longer required. Name tags will replace pandemic check-in at worship services. Please be patient as you wait to retrieve your name tag Sunday mornings and remember to social distance.



At indoor worship services, masks are required. A six foot distance between households must be maintained.

At indoor ministry activities, masks are required. A six foot distance between households must be maintained.

Communion will be distributed at the altar rail. Masks are required. A six foot distance between households must be maintained.



No mask required outdoors if six feet of distance between households can be maintained.

Coffee Hour will be held outside only in the Courtyard after the Sunday services. No mask is required outside if six feet of distance between households can be maintained.

ST. STEPHEN'S LECTORS: A WAY TO CONNECT AND SERVE

As St. Stephen's moves to in-person worship on Sunday, May 23, you may be looking for ways to be more involved in Sunday and weekday worship. During the pandemic, St. Stephen's Lay Eucharistic Ministry (LEM), has been assisting as Lectors for the Sunday live-streaming and Courtyard services and also with the Tuesday Morning Prayer service. We will continue in this capacity when services are in-person.

Lay people are an integral part of worship in the Episcopal Church. Lectors read the Lections and lead Prayers of the People (POP) on Sundays and read lessons for Morning Prayer.

St. Stephen's will be offering Lector training this Spring before we move to in-person worship on Pentecost Sunday, May 23. We will be announcing the training date and time soon.

Lector training includes:

- access to readings and POP
- preparation of readings and POP before and day of service
- procedures for announcing readings and POP
- resources available including websites
- practice reading (use of mic, pacing, and connecting with congregation).

When training is completed, new Lectors are assigned to a team and mentor.


