Dear St. Stephen's Family,

Greetings to you and your family! We are drawing closer to the end of the Advent season, and quickly approaching the celebration of the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ at Christmas. I imagine you are feeling the same strangeness I am as we prepare to celebrate in the midst of a pandemic. None the less, Christ still comes among us, and we continue, even within our current constraints, to glorify God and give thanks for the gift of Christ to the world through the incarnation.

I have been tremendously impressed, and personally moved, by the community of St. Stephen's. This past weekend the efforts of the Santa Ministry was a fantastic success! I am extremely grateful for all of you that participated in the ministry. You have provided a source of hope and the never-ending love of Christ to those in the Wimberley area that do not have adequate resources for their children and family. 

Plans are going forward to offer three in-building, in-person *Christmas Eve services* at 4:00 p.m., 7:00 p.m., and 9:00 p.m. on Christmas Eve, Thursday, December 24. Holy Eucharist will be offered at all three services. Both services at 4:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary and 7:00 p.m. in the Chapel will also be live-streamed.

The children's pageant will be held at the 4:00 p.m. service in the sanctuary. Reservations for the 4:00 p.m. Christmas Eve service will be capped at 100 people. A candlelight service will be held at the 7:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. in the Chapel with a cap of 30 people for the 7:00 p.m. and 30 people for the 9:00 p.m. A sermon will be given at the 7:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. Seating will be limited for all services, therefore, everyone will need to make a reservation online. RSVP is required and will be used for any necessary contact tracing. Please note that the 7:00 p.m. service is now full. We are still accepting reservations for the 4:00 p.m. and the 9:00 p.m.
