## **CLARIFYING THE TRUTH: DISPELLING RUMORS**

Early this week, I heard the rumor that St. Stephen's would be reopening in a couple of weeks. Understandably, in this time of chaos, a lot of confusion is in the air, and your Vestry is concerned that you may have heard the rumors as well. St. Stephen's will remain closed to the public. We will continue to conduct our business, ministry activities, and worship virtually as we have been doing since the Spring.

To clarify, we are NOT re-opening in a couple of weeks, nor do we have a new rector.

There are several reasons why we are NOT re-opening:

- The surge in the past two weeks in new and confirmed COVID-19 cases is an indicator that businesses and institutions reopened too quickly,
- Many of us at St. Stephen's are over the age of 65 and, therefore, more susceptible to the coronavirus,
- A significant number of us have compromised immune systems,
- The real possibility that some of us could be asymptomatic.

We realize there are mixed emotions on this matter; some really miss the church, communion, and camaraderie. Others prefer to wait out the pandemic. As much as we would love to open the doors, we simply cannot risk any of us

becoming ill or endangering lives.

Please, please--if you hear that we are re-opening or that we have a new rector, contact a <u>Vestry member</u> to talk about it. <u>Their e-mail addresses</u> can be found on the church website. I can assure you that when we learn of either, you will be the very next to know.

Thank you for your patience during these times, and know, if you tune into the Sunday Service being streamed through <u>YouTube</u> and <u>Facebook</u>, you will see live comments being posted by your fellow parishioners. Remember, too, that Fr. Phil makes himself available every week for 90 minutes in an Open House style session through Zoom. He invites us to visit virtually with him on Wednesdays from 10:00 a.m. until 11:30 a.m. to talk about what may be on our mind. That is some assurance that we may not be together, but we are still a family.

by card, you may do so through the *church website*. Choose "face mask" in the pull down menu of the "Give" field in the Tithe.ly online form.




## VIRTUAL COFFEE HOUR Sunday, July 05, immediately following service
