Advent, a Time of Patient Anticipation by The Rev. Kevin LJ Schubert



Dear St. Stephen's Family,

Advent is here! Sunday, November 29 marked the first Sunday of the season of Advent in which we are urged to prepare and anticipate the coming of our Savior Jesus Christ. The season is a time of expectant waiting and anticipation for the coming of Jesus Christ, especially for the nativity scene on Christmas Day. The four Sundays of Advent, leading up to Christmas, mark a time of patient anticipation that calls Christ believers to reverently and prayerfully prepare for Christ's

entrance into the world.

The Advent season begins a new year of the church calendar as well, following a three-year cycle. Each year highlights one of the synoptic Gospels of the Bible: Matthew, Mark, and Luke with a scattering of the Gospel of John throughout all three years. We are currently in the second year of that cycle (Year B) and at our primary worship services on Sunday will be reading and hearing from the Gospel of Mark. Throughout the year we will read Mark almost in its entirety. Over the past few years, I have made a tradition of beginning Advent by reading the appointed Gospel for that year in its entirety. If possible, I invite you to do the same. It's a great way to see the rhythms and textual implications of the Gospel as we enter into the new church year.

In the midst of our cultural hustle & bustle, Advent invites us into a radical notion of reflection and slowing down in order to prepare ourselves for Christ's coming. Of course, our current context of the pandemic has afforded us the opportunity to do just that. This year is a great opportunity to not miss the important design of the Advent season to slow down and enjoy the necessary preparations of the seasons to come with Christ at the center of our mind.

Advent has also traditionally been a season in which I personally take a respite from the busyness of life. For the past 15 years, some friends and I take an annual retreat the second week of Advent. This time away affords us (especially the five Episcopal priests in the group) a time of reflection, rest, and seclusion. Each year we look forward to venturing to my family ranch outside Junction, Texas in order to bask in God's creation. We spend the majority of time supporting each other in ministry, talking about church, and playing a lot of music on the porch. Every year I return from the retreat with a renewed sense of mission and gratitude for my ministry. After church this Sunday, December 6th, the group will head to the ranch for our retreat and will return the following Friday.

I am fully aware that, for many, the seasons of Advent and Christmas are difficult; as memories of loved ones that have passed or thoughts of family from whom we are estranged bring waves of grief. I pray that you feel the warm embrace of your St. Stephen's family during this time and allow God's grace and love to pour into your soul. Wherever you may be during these upcoming seasons, I pray that you are filled with God's love and restorative grace. God bless you this day and always.

COUNCIL DELEGATE SLATE WILL BE PRESENTED SUN, DEC 6




