My Dear Friends,

Advent is drawing to a close and St. Stephen's is preparing for a beautiful Christmas Eve. On Saturday, December 14, we were treated/blessed with a beautiful presentation of the traditional Kings College Cambridge setting of *A Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols*. Our newly refurbished organ was sounding heavenly and the St. Stephen's Chancel Choir sang lovely settings of some of our favorite old carols. My favorite, which always brings tears to my eyes, was the Polish traditional "Infant Holy, Infant Lowly." Between each carol Scripture lessons were read, as we were invited by the "Bidding Prayer" (see below) to, "hear and heed in Holy Scripture the story of God's loving purpose from the time of our rebellion until the glorious redemption brought to us by this holy child Jesus."



The congregation joined the choir in singing some of our favorite carols--O come Emmanuel, Joy to the World, and more. The highlight for many was when the service began with the very beautiful six-year-old Mia Sanchez singing like an angel--acapella from the pulpit-the beginning verse of "Once in Royal David's City." It was truly stunning and there was scarcely a dry eye in the Chapel. I am so very grateful to Anne Jones with the baton, Allen Hennig at the organ and piano, the Chancel Choir, and all who worked hard to make this a very special evening.

It is my heart's desire that this beautiful Advent season will be the prelude to a wonderful

Christmas experience for all of us. It is that yearly time that we can gather together and welcome Christ into our heart once again and renew our commitment to the love that

came down from heaven that starry night.

AT 5:00 P.M. CHRISTMAS EVE, we will have our own special version of "The Best Christmas Pageant Ever." We will look on as our children re-enact, in their own special and sometimes chaotic way, the beautiful ancient story and awaken the Christ Child within our hearts.

LATER AT 9:00 P.M. CHRISTMAS EVE, that holy night, we will gather in the beautiful St. Stephen's Chapel for our traditional Christmas Eve service. Led by Anne and the choir with Allen at the organ, we will sing our favorite carols once again, and celebrate the nativity of our Lord. In the glow of the candle light with the scent of frankincense filling the air, we will sing "Silent Night" to the "Holy infant, so tender and mild."

As we return to our homes and the warmth of our families, may we "sleep in heavenly peace" and may "visions of sugar plums dance in our heads."


Lastly, on behalf of your Vestry, we wish you a very "Merry Christmas" and if you are traveling, a safe journey. We look forward to an exciting 2020!

THANK YOU, ST. STEPHEN'S!

In case you have been wondering how these deserving families are chosen each season of St. Stephen's Santa, we thought we would walk you through the process.

"We reach out to families whose sons and daughters were enrolled in Camp Good Sam Wimberley the past summer, or were referred to the program by a teacher or social service agency," shares Sharon Krebs. "Children who attend Camp Good Sam must meet specific low income requirements to receive child care and developmental assistance."

This season, St. Stephen's Santa Ministry invited 75 families to participate. Based on the responses we received, we provided meals for 32 families and gifts for 86 kids.

At approximately \$100 per meal and \$100 per child for gifts and added gifts, *St.*Stephen's distributed more than \$12,000 in food and gifts on December 15 to the Wimberley community!
